Facebook

Click on the button on the top bar to open 'privacy shortcuts'

Select 'friends' to ensure that only your friends can see your posts.

At the bottom is the option to block someone.





To block a specific person, press and hold their name, click on the settings icon and press 'remove friend' or 'block'.




Instagram

You can block people under block users or prevent people from seeing your story under Story settings.

When your account is private, only people you approve can see your photos and videos on Instagram. Your existing followers won't be.

Click your profile picture next to search bar, select 'settings' then 'Security and privacy' on the left.

Tweet privacy

Protect my Tweets

If selected, only those you approve will see your Tweets. Your future Tweets will not be available publicly. Tweets posted previously may still be publicly visible in some places. [Learn more](#)

Tweet location

Add a location to my Tweets

When you tweet with a location, Twitter stores that location. You can switch location on/off before each Tweet. [Learn more](#)

[Delete location information](#)

This will delete location labels you have added to your Tweets. This may take up to 30 minutes.

Select 'Only allow people I follow to tag me in photos'. 'Protect my Tweets' means only those you approve can see your tweets – this applies to future tweets.
